Show My Homework - Change of Name/Logo.

The company are changing the name of SMHW to Satchel: One, this is a gradual process and you may have noticed the name change and home page colour scheme changes if using it on computers and lap tops. It is now rolling out to the App. If you cannot find the App on your phone/device. Don't panic - it has not been deleted; the name and icon have changed. It now looks like below, we hope this doesn't cause too much confusion for you.



Home learning:

- There is no expectation for students to complete all work set.
- It is suggested that students complete 2 3 hours of learning set a day if possible, this is only a suggestion, and we know all students are different.
- Teachers are only setting one piece of work each week or a series of challenges for the student to choose from in subjects such as ADT.
- It is advised for KS3 students to try and complete the core subjects English, Maths and Science each week.
- KS4 and KS5 students do what you can for your chosen subjects.
- Teachers have to set a deadline for the work to upload to SMHW however, you can turn off notifications and the work should not disappear should your son/daughter wish to do the activity at a later date.
- Unfortunately, we cannot control the time that the work appears on SMHW, teachers are not setting work at strange times it is simply when the system decides to release the work.
- If you are struggling with anything contact your teachers via SMHW or email. If you don't have the teachers email address, you can send your query to admin@wigstonacademy.org and we will forward it for you.

Paper Based Learning Resources:

We understand at this time that with parents and carers working from home as well as students, it is not always possible for students to access IT facilities at home. Paper based work for Year 7 to 10 are prepared and ready for collection from reception, following social distancing guidance. If there is an issue accessing these resources please do let us know and we will do what we can to help.

Teachers are already working on the next volume of the work booklets and are making sure the work is following the curriculum, as we would if the students were in school. We will of course let you know when this is ready for collection.

A message for Year 11 and 13 students:

You will have seen from Mr Wilson's letter that A-Level, GCSE, Cambridge National, Cambridge Technical and BTEC courses have now officially ended for our Y11 and Y13 students as they would have done if we were still at school and college. However, we would like to remind these students that, to date, there is still a plan for the awarding bodies to offer a series of rescheduled examinations in the Autumn term of the next academic year.

This will be particularly important for students who want to achieve a different grade from the one they will have been assessed at. On that basis, we recommend that students continue with revision activities in case this is something that they decide they want to do, even if it is just for certain subjects. When we have more information ourselves about how these rescheduled exams will operate we will be in touch with a plan for how we can support students in preparing for them.
