This term, our **KS3 students** received their first *Commitment to Learning* scores, which were celebrated in assembly and have since formed the foundation of conversations about progress and personal development. Assemblies have been lively and full of energy, with our *Times Tables Rock Stars sprint competitions*, both inter-year and inter-band, creating friendly rivalry, excitement and plenty of prizes (as well as the occasional forfeit!). 

Black History Month at WAT

"Standing Firm in Power and Pride"

In October 2025, Wigston Academies Trust marked Black History Month with a series of activities held throughout the

month. This year's theme was "Standing Firm in Power and Pride."



Students took part in an interform Black History Month quiz, giving them the opportunity to explore and celebrate UK Black history. Mr Mansoor and Mrs Nemaura also delivered assemblies to all year groups, which were warmly received. As part of these assemblies, students learned about former Leicester Mayor George Cole, using his story of resilience as inspiration for how they can demonstrate resilience in their own lives.

The Academy also hosted hair-braiding workshops during lunchtime for Years 7/8, 9/10 and 12/13, where students practised braiding using hairdressing heads. These sessions, led by Mrs Nemaura, were enjoyed and appreciated by all who attended.

To conclude the month, the College and Academy canteen introduced a special Black History Month menu on the final day of October, offering Jamaican patties, jerk chicken wraps and jerk chicken paninis. The canteen was decorated with bunting to mark the celebration and the menu proved extremely popular, selling out within minutes.

The Stephen Lawrence Ambassadors in Years 9 and 10 also presented during the Black History assemblies to encourage students to join the programme, resulting in five new ambassadors signing

up. The Stephen Lawrence Ambassador Programme is centred on empowering young people to use their voices to help build a society that treats everyone with fairness and respect.

Thanks to the inclusive work carried out over the past two years at Wigston Academy, Mrs Nemaura was invited in November by Baroness Lawrence and the Stephen Lawrence Research Centre at De Montfort University to join the team visiting the House of Lords to present the Stephen Lawrence Ambassador Programme. The group proposed expanding the programme nationally and introducing a Stephen Lawrence Charter Mark to recognise schools committed to social justice and inclusivity.






Equity and Diversity Team

Year 8 graphics have been creating design ideas for their own chocolate packaging. Their logos show a range of creativity and we are excited to see how they progress.





















Year 9 art have been looking at traditional artists and recreating some of their work.

Year 9 art have been recreating 'The green stripe' by Henri Matisse, looking at colour mixing with oil pastels.










Year 8 graphics have been drawing chocolate bars from observation and using water colour to add colour to their drawings. They've done an incredible job.



Year 9 textiles have been learning the technique called batik and have been inspired by artist Caroline Kaufman.












As part of the Year 9 textiles project, students have been exploring colour work on black paper, using their observational skills to capture the beautiful colours in the insects.










Year 9 have also been exploring the use of collage to create their colourful bugs in textiles, developing their understanding of different techniques and media.








Year 7 graphics with Miss Guiver have been practicing their one point perspective, drawing skills by creating lovely scenes.

These results meant that both our Year 8 and Year 10 teams were crowned Oadby and Wigston Champions and will now go on to represent the area in the County Cup. A brilliant achievement – well done all!

Meanwhile, in the National Cup, the Year 7 team faced Thomas Estley at home and put in a stunning second half display to win 6-2. They then faced Murray Park School in round 3 and, despite a second half comeback, didn't have enough to progress. A great effort lads and it all looks promising for next year.

The Year 8 team faced Robert Smyth, who they lost to comfortably last season. This time the boys showed amazing team spirit and resilience to win 3-1 and progress to round 3. Unfortunately, they came up against a very strong Cedars team in the next round where they were knocked out. Attention now turns to the County Cup after Christmas.

The Year 9 team also overcame a recent rival with a spectacular team display against South Wigston in round 2 of the National Cup. They drew 3-3 and then held their nerve to win on penalties. This set up a home tie v Brockington in round 3. The team showed, once again, how good they can be with a comfortable 3-1 win. Next up was Northampton School in round 4. The team was unfortunately depleted due to injuries and in a close game, the lack of fresh legs made all the difference, as we lost 5-3. A great run this year. Well done lads.

The Year 10 Boys welcomed Welland Park to Wigston Academy in Round 2 and produced a brilliant performance to run out 5-3 winners. It was Kibworth up next in round 4 (after a walkover in round 3) and a familiar face in the opposition dugout; Mr Phillips! In a competitive match, the boys showed incredible resilience at 3-1 down with 5 minutes to go with 2 late goals setting up a penalty shootout. The lads held their nerve and won 4-2 to progress into round 5. The Kings School from Grantham would be their round 5 opponents. Once again, the boys showed a brilliant attitude throughout to run out 3-2 winners and book their place in the final 32. Well done lads and good luck after the Christmas break.

The Year 11 Boys weren't to be outdone though and produced a superb round 2 performance away v Babington to come out with a 4-0 win. Next up was a home fixture against Coundon Court from Coventry. Once again, they showed brilliant determination and team work to progress with a 3-2 win. In round 4 they faced Redmoor at home. The boys showed their resilience and team spirit to grab a late equaliser in a 1-1 draw. Unfortunately, penalties proved a step too far as they lost 3-2. That brings to an end a fantastic and very successful 5 years at Wigston Academy for this team, including being Oadby and Wigston Champions four times and winning the County Cup at Seagrave.
